To read before the service

We gather at the season of Advent a time when we look forward to Jesus coming again to renew and restore all things. We do this in the light of His first coming, coming not in power but weakness and vulnerability. The birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus reveal the magitude of God's love for us.

God's love and power extend over all creation. Every life, including our own, is precious to God. Christians have always believed that there is hope in death as in life, and that there is new life in Christ over death.

Even those who share such faith find that there is a real sense of loss at the death of a loved one. We will each have had our own experiences of their life and death, with different memories and different feelings of love, grief and respect.

We are all at different stages on the journey of grief and some of you here may be supporting others in their grief. This service today is part of the support offered to each of you on your particular journey.

Welcome and Introduction

Min. We are here in the presence of God, and in the name of Christ. We come together to share in our sadness, but also to look forward with hope; to express loss, but also to give thanks; to recognise death, but also to celebrate life; to look back at all that has been, but also to look forward to all that is yet to be.

Come then in faith, for God is here - the God who has promised that, in life or in death, he is with us, the God who gives all who truly believe the assurance of his eternal blessing.

Bible Reading Romans 8:31-39

More Than Conquerors

31 What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? 32 He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? 33 Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. 34 Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. 35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? 36

As it is written:

"For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered."
37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.


